

Jan 1 - Feb 15 FROM SEED

Arugula, Broccoli, Cabbage, Chinese Cabbage, Caultflower, Celery, Cliantro, Collards, Dill, Fennel, Kale, Lettuce, Mustard Parsley, Bulb Onion (See Graphic), Potato

FROM SEEDLING TRANSPLANT

LATE WINTER

Artichoke, Broceoli, Cabbage, Chinese Cabbage, Caultflower, Celery, Clantro, Collards, Dill, Fennel, Kale, Lettuce, Mustard, Parsley, Spinach, Swiss Chard.

April 15 - May 31 FROM SEED

Amaranth, Basil, Cantaloupe, Cowpea, Cucumber, Malabar Spinach, Melon, Okra, Sorghum, Sweet Potato Slips, Summer Squash, Watermelon

FROM SEEDLING TRANSPLANT

LATE SPRING

Basil, Eggplant, Pepper

July 15 - August 31 FROM SEED

Bush Beans, Pole Beans, Corn (all types), Cowpea, Cucumber, Cantaloupe, l'Itols Onion (See Graphic), Pumpkin, Sorghum Summer and Winter Squash

FROM SEEDLING TRANSPLANT

Tomato (July 15 - Aug 15)

Oct 15 - Nov 15 FROM SEED

Beets, Carrots, Garlic, Greens, Lettuce, Mustard, Pea, Radish, Turnip, Wheat (December - January)

FROM SEEDLING TRANSPLANT

Broccoli, Cabbage, Chinese Cabbage, Cauliflower, Celery, Cilantro, Collards, Dill, Fennel, Kale, Lettuce, Mustard Parsley, Spinach, Swiss Chard

MONSOON

LATE FALL

March 1 - April 15 FROM SEED

SPRING

Amaranth, Basil, Bush Bean, Corn (Sweet), Cucumber, Jerusalem Artichoke, Malabar Spinach, Melon, Pumpkin, Sesame, Sorghum, Summer and Winter Squash, Tobacco, Watermelon

FROM SEEDLING TRANSPLANT

Basil, Eggplant, Pepper, Tomato, Tomatilo

June 1 - June 15

FROM SEED Pole Beans, Cantaloupe, Cowpea, Melon, Sweet Potato Slips

EARLY SUMMER

Sep 1 - Oct 15 FROM SEED

EARLY FALL

Arugula, Beet, Bok Choy, Broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbage, Carrot, Cauliflower, Celery, Chia, Chicory, Chinese Cabbage, Cilantro, Collards, Escarole, Fava, Garbanzo, Greens, Kale, Kohirabi, Leek, Lentils, Lettuce, Mache, Mustard, Onion (See Graphic), Parsley, Parsnip, Pea, Radish, Rape, Rutabaga, Turnip, Spinach, Swiss Chard

FROM SEEDLING TRANSPLANT

Broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbage, Chinese Cabbage, Cauliflower, Celery, Cilantro, Dill, Fennel, Kale, Lettuce, Mustard, Parsley, Spinach, Swiss Chard



GREEN BUNCHING/SCALLION August 15 - February 1




SPRING/SUMMER PLANTING SCHEDULE

- Crops that we Harvest for Fruit
 - Early Spring: Jan Mid-Feb
 - Spring: Mid Feb Mar
 - Late Spring: April Mid-May
 - Summer: Mid-May June
 - Monsoon: July Aug

FALL/WINTER PLANTING SCHEDULE

•Leafy Greens and Root Crops

- •Early Fall: Sep Oct
- •Mid Fall: Oct Mid-Nov
- •Late Fall: Mid Nov Jan
- •Winter: Jan Feb

 Plant




Grape – Vitis vinifera

- Pest Heavy


Summer Grains and Pseudograins

- Cover Crop

- Great for Birds
- Harvest Carefully

- Heavy Seed Producer
- Heat Tolerant
- Tall Growing

- Tall Growing
- Drought Tolerant
- Sugar Substitute
- Cover Crop


Holy BasilI'itois Onion

- Needs Lots of

- Great for Cover

- Collard Trees

- Asian Greens




Tree Collard – Brassica sp.

- Turns Purple in Cold Weather
- Roots from Stem




Ethiopian Spinach – Brassica carinata



- Texsel
- Fast Growing
- Edible Leaves
- Similar to Mustard
- Pollinator and Bird Attractor

Herbs and Spices



- Chia
- Cuban Oregano
- Ginger
- Horse Radish
- Mexican Oregano
- Papaloquelite
- Tumeric

Ginger - Zingiber officinale

- Grow from Sprouted Rhizomes
- Water Heavy
- Frost Sensitive

- Native Plant
- Cold Sensitive
- Perennial

Papaloquelite - Porophyllum ruderale

- Complex Flavor
- Warm Season Annual
- Great in Mexican
 Cuisine
